Main activities and responsibilities: The University of Trento, and especially its Faculty of Law, is devoting lots of efforts in establishing itself as a centre of excellence for migration studies. Apart from organizing seminars and conferences, as well as promoting publications in the field of migration law, the Faculty co-financed my post-doctoral position (the other funding institution being Centro Astalli – Trento, which assists immigrants and offers them legal services) for a study of the international practice on the protection of so-called economic migrants, who are not entitled to refugee status or subsidiary protection. Before and during this period, I also significantly contributed to both the conceiving (scientific aspect) and organization (logistic aspect) of the 2017 annual SIDI (Società Italiana di Diritto Internazionale e dell'Unione Europea) Conference on migration issues, with about 40 speakers as well as more than 200 registered attendees, as well as to the editing of its proceedings.

June 2015–September 2016

Position held: Post-doc Researcher at the University of Trento, School of International Studies

Main activities and responsibilities: The University of Trento funded, for the period 2015–2016, a project on the “Climatic change impacts on future availability of water resources and hydrogeological risks”, to be carried on jointly by the Faculty of Engineering, the Faculty of Law, the Faculty of Sociology and the School of International Studies of the same University. I was hired to conduct a research on the role of international law and, in particular, European Union law on the management of water resources under stress due to climate change. Being my research carried on jointly with hard and social sciences, and in particular with economists, I decided to focus on the economic incentives provided by the European legislator in order to encourage the improvement of water quality as well as to promote sustainability, and in particular on the principle of full recovery of costs of water services. As with my previous research on virtual water, this project was highly interdisciplinary and I had frequent occasions to explain legal issues to non-lawyers and being explained economic and engineering issues by them.

October 2013–October 2014

Position held: Post-doc Researcher at the University of Trento, School of International Studies

Main activities and responsibilities: The Italian Ministry of Education funded, for the period 2013–2016, a multidisciplinary project on “The global virtual-water network: social, economic, and environmental implications”, involving the University of Trento, the IMT Institute for Advanced Studies of Lucca, the Polytechnic University of Turin and the University of Florence. The School of International Studies of the University of Trento was in charge of dealing with the social – i.e., legal and economic – aspects of the research. In this context, I was hired to conduct a thorough study on the international legal framework applicable to the virtual water flows across the globe. This entailed a review of the most relevant norms from a number of specialized legal regimes (international water law, international trade law, international investment law, international environmental law and human rights law) as well as a frequent interaction with other social and also hard sciences.
