European Context and Purpose



European Integration Efforts

EAEVE was founded amid European efforts to harmonise professional qualifications and veterinary education standards.

Standardization Directive


EU Directive 78/1027/EEC set minimum veterinary training standards but had varied implementation across countries.

ESEVT Accreditation System

EAEVE introduced ESEVT, a transparent accreditation framework ensuring quality and consistency in veterinary training.

Broader Influence and Collaboration

EAEVE expanded beyond the EU, accrediting institutions worldwide and collaborating with European quality assurance bodies.

EAEVE Origins



- I. 1987, Montreal: Prof. Bernard Toma attended the World Veterinary Congress and noted the dominance of North American contributions.
- II. Inspiration: Together with Yves Soyeux, he sought to create a European counterpart to the AAVMC, securing support from Erasmus, the French Ministry of Agriculture, and veterinary sponsors.
- III. Founding Assembly (27 May 1988, Maisons-Alfort): 37 European veterinary school leaders adopted statutes and formally launched the AEEEV to unite and strengthen veterinary education across Europe.



History of Evaluation of ESEVT



1978: Publication of EU Directive 78/1027/EEC

1988: Foundation of EAEVE

1990: Adoption of a permanent system of evaluation – ESEVT SOP ESEVT - European System of Evaluation of Veterinary Training

2005 & 2025: Publication of EU Directives 2005/36/EC & 2025/55/EU on the recognition of professional qualifications

2016/2019/2023: ESEVT SOP is regularly revised and improved

More than 30 years of application of the ESEVT

Principles of the ESEVT



Focusing on undergraduate veterinary education to ensure a comparably high standard throughout the EU, making the mutual recognition of qualifications possible

Managing by the **EAEVE in co-operation with FVE** in full agreement with **ESG** 2015 as edited by ENQA

Final decision is taken by an independent body:
The **European Committee of Veterinary Education (ECOVE)**4 members nominated by EAEVE and 3 members nominated by FVE



Next Steps



- VEE Spaces: Replace fragmented email communications and scattered documents with centralised digital workspaces
- Streamlined Reporting & Analytics: Consolidate fragmented spreadsheets into a unified data system with automated workflows that streamline collection, processing, and analysis
- Integrated Data Infrastructure: Leverage robust data infrastructure to strengthen EAEVE's advocacy efforts, establishing performance benchmarks to monitor institutional progress and identify development priorities (ANVUR Example!)
