



(EAEVE)



## Context and purpose of the Agreement





# EUROPEAN HIGHER EDUCATION AREA

Both ANVUR and FAFVE operate within the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) and hold full membership with the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA). This shared framework provides the foundation for their collaboration.

### **DRIVING FORCES**

The agreement was prompted by the need for close cross-border cooperation in implementing European Standards and Guidelines (ESG) for Quality Assurance in Higher Education, and the recognition that Italian Veterinary Education Establishments face both national and European evaluations.

ANVUR aims to enhance the quality of higher education and research, with the objective of increasing its presence and visibility on the international stage, particularly within the European context.

## Objectives of the Memorandum



### PROMOTE COOPERATION AND DIALOGUE

Foster mutual understanding and exchange of good practices between ANVUR and EAEVE in veterinary education accreditation

### 02 COORDINATE EVALUATIONS

Identify opportunities for coordinated evaluations to improve efficiency and reduce duplication of efforts

### 03 BENEFIT ITALIAN VEES

Streamline processes for Italian Veterinary Education Establishments undergoing both national and European evaluations

### **04** MAINTAIN AUTONOMY

Preserve the independent procedures and standards established by each party in accordance with national legislation



## Areas of cooperation



The Memorandum establishes five key areas where ANVUR and EAEVE will collaborate to strengthen veterinary education quality assurance:

**INFORMATION EXCHANGE** 

Sharing accreditation standards, procedures, and developments in veterinary education and higher education quality assurance

#### **EVALUATION COORDINATION**

Streamlining procedures to reduce duplication for VEEs subject to both national and European evaluations, without replacing mandatory frameworks

#### **EVENT PARTICIPATION**

Attending relevant seminars, site visits, and conferences as observers or invited experts to learn from each other's practices

#### **JOINT INITIATIVES**

Developing working groups, training activities, and shared methodologies and evaluation frameworks 4

#### **REGULAR UPDATES**

Maintaining ongoing communication about changes and innovations in quality assurance practices

### Key commitments from the MoU

"The purpose of this Memorandum is to promote cooperation, dialogue, and the exchange of good practices between ANVUR and EAEVE in the field of veterinary education accreditation."

— Article I, Purpose

"National quality assurance activities shall remain under the sole responsibility and autonomy of the respective national agency, in accordance with national legislation."

— Preamble

"This approach will strengthen the shared understanding of national and European framework conditions for further development of Veterinary Education Establishments (VEEs). It will also reduce the administrative and financial burden on VEEs."

## Benefits and future prospects



### **EXPECTED BENEFITS**

- Reduced Administrative Burden: Italian VEEs will benefit from coordinated site visits and streamlined evaluation processes
- Enhanced Quality Culture: Shared expertise and methodologies will strengthen quality assurance practices
- Cost Efficiency: Coordination reduces financial costs associated with duplicate evaluation procedures
- Mutual Learning: Both agencies gain insights from each other's approaches and best practices

### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

- Joint Training Programmes: Development of shared training activities for evaluators and experts
- Harmonised Frameworks: Potential for more aligned evaluation methodologies whilst respecting autonomy
- Extended Cooperation: Annual feedback sessions will identify new opportunities for collaboration
- Model for others: This partnership may serve as a template for similar agreements across Europe

The agreement is valid for three years with automatic renewal, demonstrating a long-term commitment to partnership and continuous improvement in veterinary education quality assurance.

## **Conclusions**



#### STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP

The MoU establishes a formal framework for cooperation between national and European quality assurance bodies, respecting each party's autonomy whilst promoting efficiency
